We walked long distances on foot, we prayed long hours on our knees, we worked hard into the wee hours of the early morning and finally the Sambodh Center for Human Excellence has come into existence in flesh and blood. We have 32 acres of wooded land and a nearly 6000 sq. foot building area to play out our dreams—our dreams for humanity and for every individual involved.

No task can be accomplished without dedicated, self-giving team work. Such a mindset in work unleashes the vast hidden human potential. The experience of self actualization in interactive enterprises is called *moksha* or total freedom. There is no freedom in isolation and idleness.

When you dream with your eyes open it becomes a vision. It is an ability to look into the future and mould it according to our aspirations and ideals. Left to itself, Nature is a wasteful, repetitive playing out of contradictory streams of energies. It is the gaze of consciousness that makes the dance of Nature meaningful and an experience of exquisite beauty. Shakti gets her cue from the appreciative glances of Shiva. A vision is Shiva's dance with Shakti.

Sambodh Aranya, where the Sambodh Center for Human Excellence is situated, is a holy land. We also believe that unless and until we see a smile on the face of the last and least, no single individual can realize the full flourishing of his or her spirit. Equality or equal opportunity is an essential condition of humanity and freedom. Hence, we believe in voluntary simplicity, austerity and the just sharing of limited natural resources—keeping our hapless brethren, children and grandchildren in mind. 


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CHITTA SHODAKHAM MUKTI SADHANAM

Mission and Objectives of the Sambodh Center for Human Excellence

The Center is about two and a half miles west of the Kalamazoo River in rural Cooper Township near Kalamazoo, Michigan. This beautiful 32 acre wooded land rests atop a series of slopes in an area formed by glacial deposits 10,000 years ago. The forested beach-like sand, with occasional bands of rocks and boulders, rolls towards the west, overlooking the Kalamazoo River Valley that cradles the Kalamazoo River. Oak, maple, tulip, dogwood, cedar, and the rare elm tree, along with many other varieties of hardwoods, cover the grounds. Trails formerly used by hunters, hikers and off-road vehicles crisscross the land, inviting those who enjoy solitude to traverse the property on foot, in sneakers or snowshoes! Fox, deer, the white owl and box turtles have all been sited. Fragrant wild roses bloom in June. And, Michigan's state flower, the trillium—a protected flower—has been sited in the low land.

Our Objectives

- To maintain a non-denominational facility for spiritual study, dialogue, practice and dissemination of such experience knowledge in the community at large, free of discrimination in the name of religion, race, language or gender, as all are the children of God.
- To teach the unity of religious teachings and wisdom traditions of the world, and to create a culture of mutual respect and understanding through dialogue, common prayer, meditation and shared experiences.
- To work for the synergy of science and religion grounded in the ecological awareness of 'celebrating diversity" and the 'spirit of co-existence.'
- To teach, especially, the wisdom of Vedanta as expounded by Sri Sankaracharya (788-820 A.D.) and exemplified in the lives of Sri Ramakrishna (1839-89), Sri Ramana Maharshi (1879-1950) and Mahatma Gandhi (1869-1948)
- To teach the Bhagavad Gita, the Upanishads, the Brahmasutras, the Yoga Sutras and Vedantic works of Sankaracharya.
- To study the great religious texts of the world—e.g. the *Bible*, the *Koran*, the *Dhammapada* of the Buddha, etc.—and to identify their common teachings.
- To offer retreats of various durations, courses of study for the serious student and programs for youth, families, adults, professionals, managers and the public.
- To maintain a Vedantic teacher training facility.
- To support the ongoing spiritual work of Swami Bodhananda by propagating Swamiji's uniquely modern spiritual vision and message grounded in the wisdom of Vedanta, and by disseminating his lectures and publications in various formats.
- To inspire an order of *sannyasins* dedicated to the service of humanity.
