4. Tap into our shared wisdom, compassion and responsibility as individuals and as faith communities in developing practical applications, and encouraging faith in action.
5. Create a network of dialogue and opportunity for greater interaction, understanding and active engagement.
6. Disseminate the proceedings of this forum to the local community through media and various networks and forms of publication.
