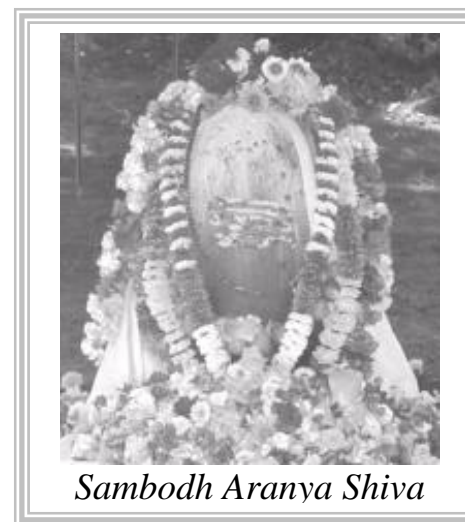

About the Rituals

Rudrabhishekam and Chandi Homa

For the abundant blessings of the Universal parents, Shiva and Shakti; for devotion and final liberation.

Maharudrabhishekam: To wash away all sins and afflictions; bring peace, prosperity and happiness and family togetherness. (Also **Anulingam**) Both on **Sunday**

Chandi Homa: To receive blessings from Goddess Chandi-Ma Vaishno Devi - for peace, prosperity and spiritual attainment. (Also **Laghu Chandi**) Both on **Sunday**

Mahalakshmi Puja and Homa: For increase in wealth and success in business. **Saturday**

Hanuman Puja: For mental strength, intellectual vigor, physical stamina; curing of all kinds of mental illnesses, and to give courage, and perseverance. **Saturday**

Dhanvantari Homa: For relief from chronic mental and physical illness. **Saturday**

Mahaganapati Homa: For removing hurdles in your business, work place, relationships and personal growth. **Sunday**

Navagraha Homa: For procuring, maintaining and enhancing wealth, health, one's reputation, and family well-being. **Sunday**

Gavatri Homa: For students enhancing memory power, concentration, recall and self-discipline; for securing good grades and admission to good colleges. **Sunday**

Mahasudarsana Homa: For protections from evil forces, enemies and unscrupulous competitors. **Sunday**

Statement by Swami Bodhananda Saraswati

The power of rituals which uses a combination of *mantra*, *tantra* and *yantra* are far greater in organizing the forces of nature in the supplicant's favor than mere prayer which is often said without much faith or concentration. The *Vedas* prescribe many rituals for the fulfillment of legitimate human desires: worthy children, happy family life, health, wealth, recognition, professional success, as well as for peace of mind here and hereafter.

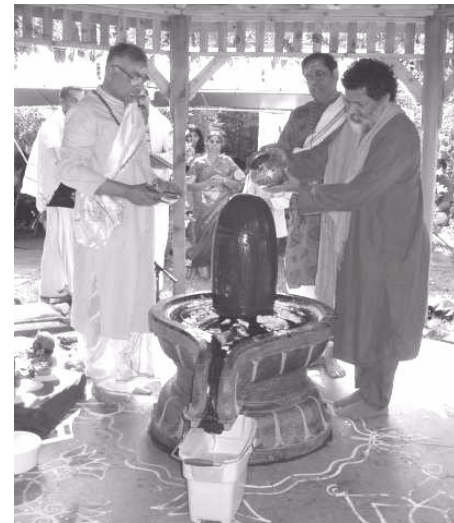
Parking @ Sambodh!

**6363 North 24th Street
Kalamazoo, MI 49004**

❖ **From I-94** in Kalamazoo, take the **Sprinkle Road** exit (Exit 80) and proceed north. One stop light past Gull Road, at the intersection of Sprinkle Road with **G Avenue**, make a left onto G Avenue and drive about ½ mile to the **24th Street**. **Turn right onto 24th Street** and drive about 1.75 miles. About 500 feet after the paved road ends, you will find the **Sambodh driveway on your left**. Note the **6363 mailbox** number. That's Sambodh!

❖ **From North, Hwy-131**, take the **D Avenue Exit (44) ramp**, and turn East onto D Avenue. Drive about 6 miles until D Avenue makes a broad sweeping curve from East to South. At that point it is called **Sprinkle Rd.** About 1 to 1.5 miles watch for **F/G Avenue**. Make a right turn on to F/G and drive about ½ mile to **24th Street**. Make a right turn on 24th Street. Go to the end of 24th Street (about 1 mile) and, after the paved road ends, you will find the **Sambodh driveway on your left**. Note the **6363 mailbox** number. That's Sambodh!
